Council Agenda Request for OPWC Pre-application

Engineering is requesting council time to seek approval to submit the pre-application and subsequent application, if successful, for the following project:

Summit Street Traffic Signal Coordination Project – This project is currently included in the Capital Plan and consists of installation of new traffic signals from Lincoln to Loop Road with central coordination. The project also includes safety improvements along the corridor to eliminate 4 of the top 6 accident intersections as ranked by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (AMATS). During the preliminary engineering of the project it was determined that some modifications to the funding alternate were needed as more information was received. One significant change is that the pavement along the corridor is in need of complete replacement due to poor base conditions. Therefore, we are seeking OPWC funding to cover a portion of the increase in funding necessary to complete the project. We are requesting approximately \$490,000 from OPWC.

Chairperson Heineking convened the meeting and welcomed the new member of the Civil Service Commission, Mr. Kenneth Hodar.
