CITY OF KENT BUDGET & FINANCE

The Engineering Division is requesting to appropriate \$175,000 in Sewer funds to repair the sanitary sewer located between the Cuyahoga River and CSX Railroad Tracks south of Main Street. The project includes slope protection to shore up recently eroded areas and repairs to foundations/structures which support the 16" sewer. The costs of repairs are significant due to the difficulty in accessing the sewer and the need to coordinate the repairs with the CSX Railroad.

The above funds requested are offset by the following projects where appropriations were released in 2017 and will not be requested for re-appropriation in 2018:

River Street Sanitary Replacement
 Phase 1, Cedar Street Reconstruction
 South Chestnut Street Sanitary Sewer
 \$140,286 (project completed)
 \$30,000 (funds not required)
 \$10,570 (project completed)

Please note that the situation along the sewer line is evolving as new problems are discovered, approvals from the railroad are obtained and quotes are received from contractors. Future appropriation requests may be required to complete the repairs and stabilize the area.

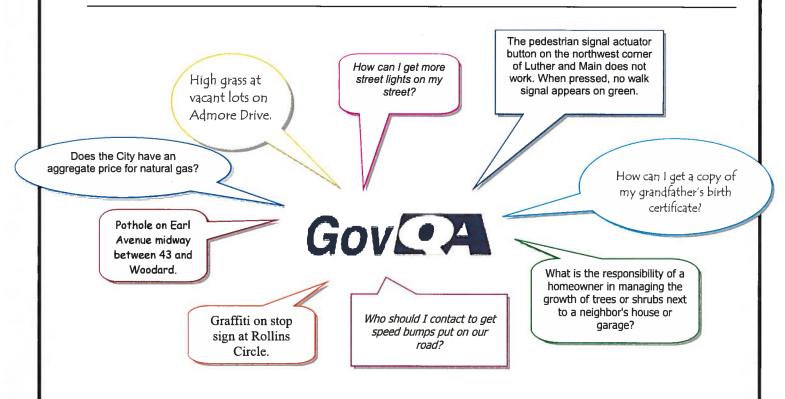

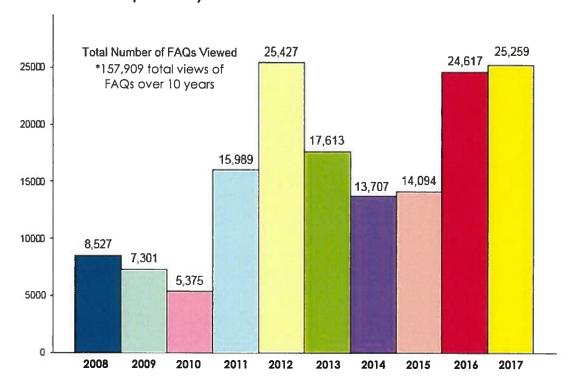

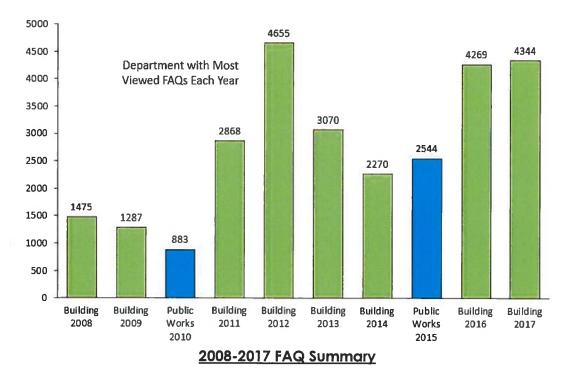
Using this data we hope to be able to continue to provide better, more convenient and effective service to citizens while saving resources.

The top FAQ the last five years has been "Does the City provide public garbage pick-up?"

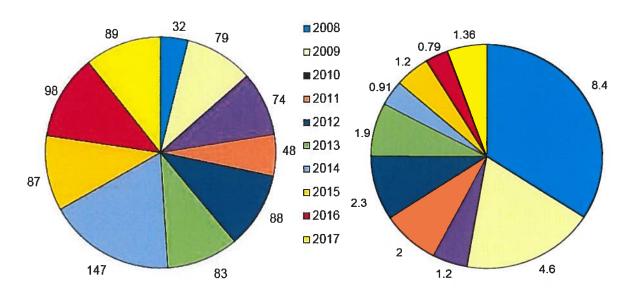

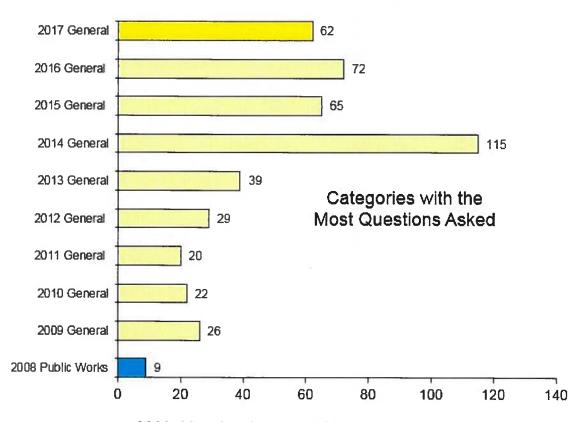

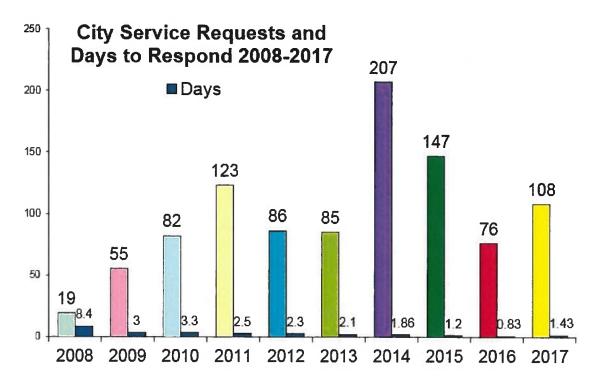

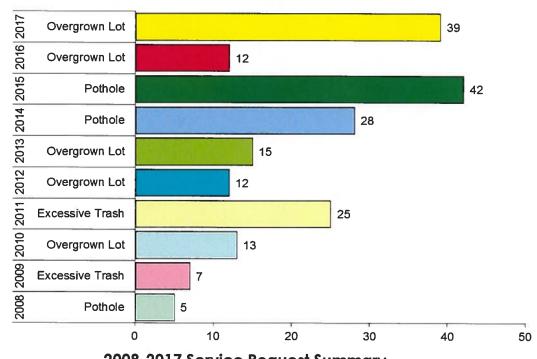
