Re: Emergency purchase of new computer for Clerk of Council

Council is requesting a budget amendment in the amount of \$1,500 for a capital purchase of a new desktop computer and a *licensed* version of Adobe Acrobat Pro DC software. The funds were requested for the 2018 budget, however time is of the essence as the Clerk's current CPU has been continuously overheating, freezing and/or shutting down, prohibiting the Clerk from efficiently performing her duties.

I.T. Director, Gary Bishop, has looked at the CPU several times, run diagnostics on it, and cannot figure out why it is constantly running at maximum processing speed, as there are no viruses present, and it no longer has the capacity to run more than one software program at a time, then freezes and/or overheats and shuts down. Mr. Bishop stated there is no temporary replacement available for the Clerk to use.

With the above justification, I request a budget amendment be made for the purchase of a new computer as quoted by Mr. Bishop.

Appropriation Amendments Needed

2 amendments to appropriations in fund 126 are needed due to the tracking of expenses in the accounting system.

One amendment is needed to the capital line 126-04-540-401-7680 due to issuing a check to a vendor in 2016, then that vendor losing the check and having to re-issue the check again in January of 2017 using the 2017 budget instead of the 2016 budget. Also a vendor that renamed it's company including a new Federal ID # caused us to close out one PO and issue another one that used some of the 2017 budget. We are requesting a capital increase in fund 126 of \$12,600.

The 2nd amendment to fund 126 appropriations is to the O+M line 126-04-540-401-7992 due to the activity in this account being booked to a separate restricted bank account that does not automatically link to the general ledger, and requires journal entries to be booked to the system. Because of this unlinked process, purchase orders from a prior year do not feed into the current year budget correctly. We are requesting an O+M increase in fund 126 of \$25,000.

Reference: West Side Fire Station Expansion/Renovation (2016 KFD007) and Roof

Rebuild/Replacement (2016 KFD006) Projects

As you may recall, in late 2015 the fire department several identified key deficiencies in the roof structure at the West Side Fire Station. In addition, we noted operational problems with a notable lack of gear storage and EMS supply storage at that station. Two project codes were initiated, and the funds appropriated for 2016:

West Side Fire Station Roof Rebuild/Replacement (2016 KFD006) \$150,000 West Side Fire Station Expansion/Renovation (2016 KFD007) \$100,000

An architect was hired to develop the plans to add a pitched roof and an addition onto the rear of the building. The plans were developed, however difficulties arose with the architect and he was unable to complete the project. The project did not have any expenses in 2016.

The project was renewed with another architect early 2017 and since then we have developed a plan for pushing forward.

I am requesting appropriations to continue these projects in 2017 for the same amounts identified above.

Emergency Repairs to Sanitary Sewer Supports

Emergency Appropriations Request

The Engineering Division is requesting to appropriate \$19,000 from the Sanitary Fund (202) to authorize the design of emergency repairs to the support system for the sanitary sewer that runs along the Cuyahoga River between Stow Street and Main Street. The issue was discovered during a site visit to evaluate reported cracks in the sanitary sewer, just south of Main Street that had been reported August 17, 2017. The sanitary sewer is exposed in this section, and supported by piers next to the CSX railroad tracks. Several of the piers have failed or are damaged. Pictures of some of the failed/damaged piers have been attached.





Appropriations Request: Ametek CORF Grant Soil Remediation

The City of Kent has been working on completing the various remediation activities needed to address the hazardous environmental conditions at the former Ametek site, located at 627 Lake Street.

Recent changes in vapor intrusion standards established by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) necessitated a modification to the mitigation methodology utilized on the site to address underground chlorinated solvents still remaining on the site. A subcontractor was selected to remove some of the contaminated soil and the cost for the removal will be reimbursed to the City as part of its Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund (CORF) grant draw request that will be submitted to the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA).

I am respectfully requesting the appropriation of \$82,000.00 to the Service Department "Contract" construction project line item (301-05-560-604-7680) in order to pay the contractor for the completion of the final environmental hazard soil remediation activities on the site.
