Mask Resolution for City Council

COVID-19 is still an evolving situation. Scientists are still learning more about the SARS-COV-2 organism and how it infects and affects us. It is important to continue to adapt as we learn how to best protect ourselves and each other. We need to be ready to act on the most pertinent and reliable information as it is available.

At first, masks for the general population were not indicated or encouraged because there was not awareness of how much the virus was circulating in our communities, how it was spread, and the fact the United States does not have a culture of appropriate mask wearing. Now we know the virus is circulating in our communities and it spreads easily person to person via respiratory droplets and possibly via airborne particles. It makes sense scientifically to wear masks or cloth face coverings as source control. This is not a political statement, it is based on research and real-life situations reported on COVID-19 spread.

Cloth face coverings (CFC) and procedure masks, when worn correctly, protect others from the wearer. To a certain degree CFC also provide a small level of protection to the wearer. Because of this, the more people who wear masks or cloth face coverings, the more protection is offered to all. This is especially true since not all individuals can wear a mask or CFC due to medical conditions. Wearing CFC does not replace social or physical distancing, but works synergistically to help keep the virus away from individuals. Wearing a mask or CFC is a respectful and caring behavior, as well as, one based on the best information we currently have.
