1. City / University Sports Commission Project

During the 2007-08 academic year, the City of Kent partnered with Kent State University Athletics and the College of Sports and Leisure to develop a framework for a new Kent-based sports commission. The purpose of this work was to prepare an outline for a new organization with the capability of attracting more sporting events to the greater Kent area. I'm pleased to report that this group successfully competed for the Ohio girls statewide rugby tournament that brought 20 teams to Kent in May. I've included a copy of the draft organizational report that the students working with our staff prepared. The organization is still in its formative stages but I'm encouraged by the progress we've made.
