REQUESTED ACTION: Conditional Zoning Certificate and Site Plan

Review & Approval to operate an open air market

ZONING: R-C: High Density Multifamily-Commercial District

TRAFFIC: The parcel is accessed from South Water Street.

SURROUNDING LAND USES: The property is surrounded by commercial uses on

the north, west and south side and residential on

the east side.

APPLICABLE CODE SECTIONS: Chapters 1107, 1113, 1137 and 1171 of the Kent

Codified Ordinances.

ANALYSIS:

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The pastor of the Water Street Church is requesting to operate an open air market on site. The church has approximately 4.5 acres of open land and has been providing garden plots and water to local residents to grow produce, flowers, etc. The "growers" have expressed an interest in selling their crops. The Church is requesting to set up tables on site on Mondays from 3 pm to 6 pm during the growing/harvest season.

Open air markets are conditionally permitted in the R-C zoning district and are subject to some other requirement(s) outlined in Sections 1171.01 (50) of the Kent Codified Ordinances as listed below. Staff feels that these conditions have been met.

- (50) In granting approval of a conditional zoning certificate for an "open air market", the Commission shall specify the exact dates, time and location of the sales and any other conditions. This information shall be supplied by the applicant at the time of application. In considering the request for approval, the Commission shall use the following criteria:
 - (a) The operation of the market shall be limited to the period of the day between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
 - (b) Adequate parking shall be provided in the event that an "open air market" should be proposed for a parking lot; it shall not compromise usage of the lot as would be required for other businesses or activities.
 - (c) "Open air markets" shall not be disturbing or adverse to residential areas.
 - (d) All operations shall comply with all other applicable local and State codes and regulations.
 - (e) A permit shall be issued for a period not to exceed three years. (Ord.1986-11 Passed 3-5-86.)

TRAFFIC/PARKING:

Ingress and egress is from South Water Street. The existing parking spaces are adequate to accommodate the church and the market. The market hours are selected to not conflict with Church meeting hours.

UTILITIES:

Utility connections are existing. The church will be open for access to restroom and drinking fountains.

STORMWATER:

Stormwater management is existing.

SIGNAGE:

Signage will be used on the day of the market only.

LIGHTING/LANDSCAPING/DUMPSTER:

This is an existing site with existing lighting, landscaping and dumpster.

ARCHITECTURAL ADVISORY BOARD:

The Architectural Review Board is not required to review this project.

VARIANCES:

No variances are required

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval.

The Planning Commission may approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove the application. Should Planning Commission wish to make a motion for this project the following language may be used:

I move that in Case PC12-007, the Planning Commission approve the Conditional Zoning Certificate and Site Plan to operate an open air market at Water Street Church located at 1541 South Water Street subject to the following conditions.

- 1. A Fire extinguisher shall be required if there is to be gas fired appliances and or electrical appliances located in the Market.
- 2. A fire Lane shall be observed in front of the mercantile area per Codified City Ordinance 351.01.
- Any use of electrical appliances shall comply with the Ohio Fire Code. Such use shall
 have GFCI outlets and electrical cords shall be outdoor rated and approved by the Fire
 Prevention Bureau.
- 4. All electrical and gas devices and systems to be employed shall be subject to fire safety inspection by Kent Fire Prevention.

Commissioner's Report

We have received all but one food service license renewal. A letter informing them their business will be closed if license fee is not received was sent last week. Swimming pool applications and solid waste truck applications have been mailed to operators.

City council approved the hiring of an additional sanitarian and an EH technician position. We will continue to work with the Service Department on developing a work schedule and duties for the position.

The sanitarian exam for applicants is going to take place on April 24th. The job has been posted so hopefully we will get two good applicants for the position.

Flu activity remained low in Ohio compared to widespread in many of Ohio's neighbors. There was a slight increase in emergency room visits but overall it has been a great year with minimal flu activity.

Jeff stated that he attended the KSU Health Fair and it was evident after talking with students that we need to spend some time developing our internship program.

Included in your packet was information on the County Health Rankings. I would like to look at the rankings under new business and see where we can include efforts to address some of the Portage County deficiencies.

Kent is in the process of updating its sewer ordinance which will now address the Fats, Oil, and Grease from food service locations. Working with Gene Roberts on this initiative.

We have started larvaciding for mosquitoes and expect an earlier start to the mosquito season by a few weeks thanks to our mild winter and early spring.

Jeff has been asked to serve on the Regional Disaster Healthcare Planning Group. The first meeting is in Akron on April 30th.

We have been working with the Service Department on obtaining an accurate list of all the Household Sewage Disposal Systems in Kent. The map in front of you uses GIS to cite the location of each household sewage system.

Old Business

Staffing - We are continuing to work with the Service Department on the Job Description for Environmental Technician. The person in this new position will spend ½ their time doing Service Dept. work and ½ their time doing Health Department work.

New Business

Jeff will put together some mission and visions statements to be considered by the Board. The goal is to have these completed at the May 2012 Meeting.

Jeff stated that he is considering issuing penalties for nuisance complaints. He needs to study the ordinance and talk to the Law Department.

Jeff went over the Portage County Health Rankings, and where we will need to improve in the future.

The Farmers Market needs signage prohibiting animals at the market.
