Motion:

A motion was made by Susan Roxburgh and seconded by Jack Amrhein to approve the Expenditures and Encumbrances for the month of June 2012. The motion passed.

Commissioner's Report

New employees, Justin Smith and Kyle Kelly have been a great addition to our department. Justin's food service experience has really helped this department in identifying non-compliance with the State of Ohio Food Code and Kyle has been a big help thus far in the Housing Program.

We have been working quite a bit with University Oaks, the Province, and the University Edge Apartments to educate them on our Housing Code and to get them in compliance with the code prior to the mid August move in time.

Jeff stated that he was nominated through the City Manager's office to attend the 2013 class of Leadership Portage County and accepted the invitation to attend the 2012-2013 sessions.

In response to Dr. Bartholomew's request at the last meeting, Jeff has been reviewing various rabies control protocols specifically from Portage and Summit Counties. I plan to have a protocol developed by the next board meeting for review and approval.

We have finally received our other car from vehicle maintenance. It had to have some repairs done prior to us receiving it but it has been up and running for several weeks now with no issues.

The Public Health Futures Committee just released the Public Health Futures Report identifying 12 recommendations for the future of Ohio's Public Health System. The committee consisted of health commissioners from City and County Health Districts. The findings of the report will be presented at next month's board meeting.

We have been working with Ray's Place, Water Street Tavern, the Firefly and Taco Tonto's on developing a better system for their trash removal. Currently, they put their trash out in bags on a daily basis in the alley between the facilities. If you have ever walked in that alley, it is constantly full of grease, debris, chicken bones, etc. We are looking at developing a secure system on the sidewalk in the alley to place covered trash receptacles so we don't have trash bags sitting there throughout the day to attract rodents and vermin. Supposedly, this has been an ongoing issue for the last 33 years.

We are still waiting on our two new computers from Portage County. They finally have a PO established for the computers. Also, the City of Kent will hopefully have their new servers in this week. I have been waiting for the new computers and servers before I go ahead and order our new software for the health department.

Finally, enclosed with your materials is the Portage County June Public Health Emergency Preparedness Report, boom cars letter of support, and information on House Bill 487 that will affect ODH and local public health.

Old Business

Mission and Vision changes have been made and distributed for Health Board approval.

Motion:

A motion to approve the Mission and Vision for the Health Department was made by Susan Roxburgh and seconded by Marchelle Bobbs. With no objection, the motion was passed.

New Business

The Health Department is using an intern to develop a composting program. He will work on the project from July through September. He will produce some education materials regarding proper composting.

Jeff stated that there have been some Food Service Compliance issues recently. It has been discovered that many operations do not have a hand washing sink in the kitchen. We are requiring those businesses to install a sink.

Jeff stated that the Health Department is actively pursuing the possibility of Health employees being able to issue fines/citations for trash and housing license noncompliance of orders. We have sought an opinion from the Law Department.

Townhall II would like a letter of support from the Health Department in regards to their grant application for the continuation of funds for Violence Against Women Act.

Motion:

A motion was made by Jack Amrhein and seconded by Susan Roxburgh for Jeff Neistadt to draft a letter of support to Townhall II as requested. With no objection, the motion passed.

In fact, it was never my intent to stay at the Kent Fire Department but after the first several years, I enjoyed working for the City and the fire department so much I decided to stay and finish my career in Kent. I will miss working with you and all of the other staff members and all the members of the fire department. I believe that we have functioned well as a team and have done positive things for the City and the residents.

The job of fire chief has expanded over the years and while we have tried to add a second administrative position, the City needs to take a serious look at this position and consider filling this request. This will enable the department to function more efficiently and be more consistent in delivering service on all three shifts. In addition, this position would also help prepare the next potential chief so that there is not such a big learning curve for the new chief.

I can't believe it has come to an end but I must do what is best for my health and my family. Therefore my last day of employment with the City of Kent will be at the end of the payroll period on Sunday, August 12th, 2012. There is still much to be done in the department but I believe that we have a very talented group of officers ready to accept the challenge and continue to move the department ahead.

Once again, thank you for everything you have done for me and the department during my tenure as Chief.
