John has requested Committee time for Council's approval to sell the City's obsolete surplus fire and police radios for \$1,525. (attachment)


Administration Recommendation

Hope and Bridget have requested Council's consideration of an Ordinance to temporarily suspend the current developer impact fee formula used in the calculation of the Parks and Recreation development fees. At the advice of the City's professional financial advisory firm, the Law Department, and the Community Development Department, we are asking Council to allow the staff time to review the current formula and return to Council with recommendations for fees that are consistent with standard practices among peer cities. Finance Committee

1. Proposed Ordinance to Apply for Covid-19 Grant Funds (Hope)

Chief Tosko has requested Council's authorization to submit for Covid-19 grant funding to offset the extra costs resulting from the pandemic. In light of the increasing number of Covid-19 grant funding opportunities, and the often short submission deadlines, staff is also requesting Council pass an ordinance providing blanket approval for City departments to submit grant applications without Council's approval of each grant application individually. Administration Recommendation

Council provided similar blanket authority to accept Covid-19 donations and I recommend approval of the blanket Ordinance to apply for and allocate Covid-19 grant funds.

<u>Information Items</u>

1. Income Tax Report

Rhonda has provided a summary of income tax collections thru the end of March 2020. Overall the City income tax collections are up 8.43% (\$287,668) from March 2019. Kent State University's collections are up 6.08% (\$76,816). (attachment)

2. Kent Police Statistics

Chief Lee has provided the police statistics report for March 2020. In 2020 calls for service are down 18% (1,345 calls); traffic citations are down 15% (125 tickets); accident incidents are up 3% and serious crimes are up 9% (13 cases). (attachment)

3. Fire Incident Reports

Chief Tosko has provided the fire and emergency medical services report for February 2020. Calls for fire service are down 3.5% (6 calls); fire mutual aid assistance is up 1 event from 2019; and EMS responses are down 8% (51 calls). (attachment)

4. Health Department Statistics

Joan Seidel has provided the statistical report for March 2020. Health Department revenues are down 9.5% (\$19,886.90) and permit numbers have decreased by 48 from this time in 2019. (attachment)
