# <u>Information Items</u>

#### 1. Fire Incident Reports

Chief Samels has provided a copy of the fire and emergency medical services reports for September 2024. The MTD calls for fire service are up 5.5% (7 calls) compared with 2023. Calls for fire mutual aid assistance received MTD is up from 0 to 3 calls for the month in 2024 as compared to 2023; and EMS responses are up 22.6% (by 74 calls) for 2024, compared to MTD 2023. ### 2. Income Tax Report

Rhonda Hall has provided a summary of income tax collections for September of 2024. Overall, the City income tax collections YTD are up 3.4% (\$448,692) compared with YTD of 2023. For the month of September, the City income tax collections are up 3.8% (\$47,648) compared to 2023. (attachment)

### 4. Monthly Permit and Zoning Reports
