Unauthorized Items

1. Revised City/State Bridge Inspection Ordinance (Hope)

After passing the City and ODOT Bridge Inspection agreement in October, the State advised us that they needed to insert some new language to that agreement. Hope has made the text changes to that agreement and we need Council's approval on the revised language. (attachment)



Authorize the revised language to the City and ODOT bridge inspection agreement.

Council Action

Approve the revised agreement language to the City and ODOT bridge inspection agreement for 2023, with the emergency clause.



1. Income Tax Report

Rhonda Hall has provided a summary of income tax collections for the November of 2022. Overall, the City income tax collections YTD are up 12.2% (\$1,672,518) compared with November of 2021. For the month of November, the City income tax collections are up 11.4% (\$149,316) compared to November 2021. (attachment)

2. Kent Police Statistics

Chief Shearer has provided a copy of the police statistics report for November 2022. In 2022 calls for service are down 5.1% (by 84 calls); traffic citations are down 20% (36 tickets); accident incidents are down 4.5% (3 incidents) and serious crimes are up at 1 incident compared to zero in November of 2021. 3. New Low Income Housing Rehab Grant Funds

Bridget has provided a memo announcing that Community Development was successful in applying for grant funds in the amount of \$250,000 which will be available to eligible low income residents to make repairs to their homes (owner occupied property) through the City's Community Housing Impact and Preserving (CHIP) program.
