Allen Drive Bridge over Fishcreek Replacement

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has recently announced a new \$110 million Ohio's Bridge Partnership Program. Ten million dollars from this program is intended to repair/replace at least twenty municipally owned bridges in fiscal years 2015-2017. ODOT recently notified the City that ODOT selected Kent's Allen Drive Bridge over Fish Creek as one of the municipally owned bridges to be replaced with this program. Under this program, ODOT will fund 100% of costs to replace the bridge and manage the design and construction of the entire project. ODOT will work with the City to develop an appropriate scope for the replacement of the bridge.

Prior to the notification by ODOT of this program, the City had identified the Allen Drive Bridge as the next structure in need of replacement/rehabilitation. The design of the replacement/rehabilitation was included in the 2013 Capital Plan and our central maintenance division sealed the bridge deck in 2013 to prevent continued deterioration of the structure.

The engineering division recommends approval of the consent legislation as the replacement of the Allen Drive Bridge is an identified need of the City and will cost the City a significant amount to replace on its own.

ODOT - Bridge Inspection Program Services

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has offered to provide bridge inspection services to local governments for the next three years. Currently the National Bridge Inspection Program (NBIS) requires that bridge owners perform oversight including the following for all their federally classified bridges (length greater than 20 ft):

- Inventory vehicular bridges with ODOT
- Annually inspect bridges
- Perform Load Ratings for their bridges
- Determine Scour Critical Structures .
- Perform within hand reach inspections on fractural critical bridges every 2 years

Currently the City spends approximately \$9,000 per year on bridge inspection services for all federally classified and non-federally classified bridges (pedestrian and railroad bridges). Even though ODOT will not be performing all of the bridge inspection services that the City currently does, they will provide the majority of the inspection services which will still save the City significant resources. Therefore, the engineering division recommends approval of the consent legislation to have ODOT perform Bridge Inspection Services for the City.

Additional 301 Fund Appropriations Request – Street and Sidewalk Programs

The Engineering and Central Maintenance Divisions are requesting an additional \$250,000 in appropriations for the street and sidewalk programs in 2014. The primary reason for the request is that the exceptionally hard winter of 2013-2014 has caused accelerated deterioration of our streets, including the repair of numerous water main breaks (23 since January 1st). Due to the increase in street repairs to be performed by Central Maintenance this year, they will not be able to perform pavement repairs in preparation for our seal coat program as in previous years. Therefore we are required to contract out the work to complete this years program. The projected uses for the additional appropriation requests are:

- 1. An additional \$74,000 is requested to contract out the repair of seal coat streets and budget for additional repairs on the streets to be milled and resurfaced in the current 2014 program.
- 2. An additional \$46,000 is requested for Central Maintenance to purchase additional materials to maintain/repair the streets not included in the 2014 street program.
- 3. An additional \$130,000 is requested to add three additional streets for concrete repairs, including sidewalks, milling and resurfacing to this years program.

We believe that the current condition of the streets after this winter constitutes an emergency situation and therefore we recommend that this funding be taken from the reserve portion of the 301 Capital Fund. The allocation of these funds is not expected to affect any previously approved programs from the 301 Capital Fund.

We understand that this is a significant request, however we believe that the needs are severe and must be addressed.

Communication Spend

Staff has been working to reduce the monthly cost of phone and data communication for the City. The communication market is not much different than the electric generation market in that there is one local transmitter (the last mile by AT&T) and multiple carriers that provide service over the local transmitter's facilities. The market is dynamic as capacity is sold based on market supply and demand.

Council's previously approved for staff to make the best deal possible for the City when purchasing electrical generation, staff respectfully requests the same ability to complete a similar process with a communication vendor(s). What can be accomplished by the City if the market can be responded too in a short time period with multiple vendors is the estimated reduction in our communication spend by over 50%.

Staff respectfully requests Council consideration and approval to allow for staff to negotiate agreements for the City's communication spend using the similar method permitted when purchasing electrical generation.

Last fall Craig Peeps wrote an AFG grant for all new protective gear for every firefighter. If we get this it will be a huge cost savings for the city (our gear is getting near the end of It's life). The grant is for \$91,740 with a matching 10% from the city. The feds pick up \$82,566 and the city would have to pick up just \$9,174. Manthey might have already told all this to you, but I believe that the accepting authority (city council) has to vote to accept the grant and the city's pick up prior to the grant being awarded.

Just yesterday he wrote a fire prevention grant for \$14,681, (we want to purchase lock boxes for senior citizens and key security for our keys), the feds pick up \$13,947 and our pick up is \$734. Again, city council should vote to accept this grant and the city's pick up amount.

Could we get these on the next council docket, the AFG grant should be awarded in the next several months. No guarantees here, but every bit helps.

RE: 2014-2015 Road Salt Purchase

The State of Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), Office of Contracts has contacted the City regarding the City's participation in their rock salt purchase contract for the 2014-2015 winter season. In recent years the City has received its best price for road salt by participating in the ODOT purchase program contract.

This year ODOT is planning to issue two separate contracts for the upcoming 2014 summer and 2014-15 winter season. Gerald Shanley, Central Maintenance Facilities Manager advises upon receipt of the total salt to be delivered under the current 2013-2014 ODOT contract (4,200 tons) the City will again end this winter season with the salt dome nearly full (approximately 4,000 tons in storage). Gerald continues to monitor shipment of salt and has been advised by the vendor that they plan on filling the City's total salt order.

The ODOT contract requires participating agencies to designate a quantity of rock salt to be purchased with a plus or minus factor guaranteed. Under the 2013-2014 contract the City committed to the purchase of 3,500 tons (-20% 2,800 tons and +20% 4,200 tons). This year the ODOT purchase contract is changing slightly from a purchase obligation of 80% to 120% of the anticipated need to 90% to 110% purchase obligation. Due to storage constraints Gerald recommends that the City participate only in the ODOT winter season contract during 2014-2015, committing to the purchase of 4,000 tons (90% minimum required purchase of 3,600 tons and 110% maximum purchase obligation of 4,400 tons).

Staff requests authorization for the purchase of the road salt through the ODOT rock salt purchase contract for the 2014-2015 winter season. The exact price for the 2014-2015 contract for the purchase of rock salt is not known by ODOT as they are advertising their bid for the program at this time. Historically, the City has experienced savings with participation in the ODOT rock salt purchase contract. It is anticipated purchases under the 2014-2015 contract term will be higher than the current price due to the high demand for road salt this past year, but due to the competitive bidding process staff knows of no reason to believe that the City will not continue to experience some savings by participating in the contract.

This ODOT Office of Contracts set an extremely short deadline of April 8, 2014 for commitment of this purchase. Staff respectfully requests an unauthorized resolution with an emergency declaration by Kent City Council authorizing participation in the ODOT contract for the 2014-2015 winter season for purchase of rock salt at the April 2, 2014 Council Meeting.

Staff has attached the current dangerous dog ordinance for the City of Kent. Additionally, ordinance examples from the cities of Streetsboro, Barberton, and Strongsville are also attached for your review.

# City of Kent Ordinance 505.18 DANGEROUS DOGS.

- (a) As used in this section, "dangerous dog" means:
- (1) Any dog with a known propensity, tendency or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals; or
  - (2) Any dog which attacks a human being or domestic animal without provocation; or
- (3) Any dog owned or harbored primarily or in part for the purpose of dog fighting or any dog trained for dog fighting.
- (4) No dog shall be deemed dangerous if it bites or menaces a trespasser on the property of its owner, if the owner has taken reasonable steps to protect the general public or lawful entrants on the property from attacks by the animal. Nor shall any dog be deemed dangerous if it harms or menaces anyone who has tormented or abused it.
  - (b) Process for determination of "dangerous dog" status:
- (1) The determination that a dog is a dangerous dog shall be made by the Chief of Police or his/her designee.
- (2) The owner or harborer of the dog or dogs deemed to be "dangerous dog(s)" shall be mailed a letter, at the owner's last known address, by the Police Department, informing the owner that their dog(s) has been deemed to be a "dangerous dog(s)" pursuant to City of Kent Code Section 505.18. The letter shall include a description of the dog (if available).
- (3) Upon receipt of the letter referred to in Section 505.18 (b)(2), the owner of the dog(s) may appeal the finding that his/her dog(s) is a "dangerous dog."
- A. The appeal shall be filed with the Police Department and it shall be in writing. The appeal must be filed within 30 days of the date the letter was mailed to the owner.
- (4) Upon receipt of a timely filed appeal, the City Manager shall appoint an administrative hearing officer to hold a hearing on the appeal which hearing shall be within 30 days of receipt of the notice of appeal. The hearing date may be continued to a later date by agreement of the parties. The hearing officer shall issue a written opinion, either upholding or overturning the determination that the dog(s) is a dangerous dog.
- (5) The owner of a dog that has been determined to be a "dangerous dog(s)" by the administrative hearing officer pursuant to City code Section 505.18 (b)(4) may appeal the decision of the administrative hearing officer to the Portage County Court of Common Pleas. Said notice of appeal must be filed with the Court within 30 days of the date the owner received a copy of the administrative hearing officer's written opinion.

(Ord. 2005-84. Passed 7-20-05.)

- (c) No person owning or harboring or having the care or custody of a dangerous dog shall suffer or permit such dog to go unconfined on the premises of such person. A dangerous dog is "unconfined" as the term is used in this section, if such dog is not securely confined or confined in a securely enclosed and locked pen or a dog run area upon the premises of such person. Such pen or dog run area shall also have sides of at least six feet in height and a secure top. The structure shall also have a foundation of either concrete or asphalt.
- (d) No person owning or harboring or having the care of a dangerous dog shall suffer or permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such person unless the dog is securely muzzled and restrained with a chain having a minimum tensile strength of 300 pounds and not exceeding three feet in length.

- No person shall own or harbor any dog for the purpose of dog fighting, or train, torment, badger, bait or use any dog for the purpose of causing or encouraging such dog to unprovoked attacks upon human beings or domestic animals.
- No person shall possess with intent to sell or offer for sale, breed or buy or attempt to buy within the City any dangerous dog. the requestion of the same and the same and
- Any person owning or harboring or having the care of any dangerous dog shall maintain a (g) policy of insurance in an amount not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) insuring such person against any claim, loss, damage or injury to persons, domestic animals or property resulting from the acts of a dangerous dog. Such person shall produce evidence of the insurance upon the request of a law enforcement agent.
- In the event that a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a dangerous (h) dog is being harbored or cared for in violation of subsections (b), (c) or (d) hereof, the law enforcement agent may petition a court of competent jurisdiction to order the seizure and impoundment of the dangerous dog pending trial. In the event that a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a dangerous dog is being harbored or housed in violation of subsections (c) or (d) the law enforcement agent may seize and impound the dangerous dog pending trial.

### (i) Penalty.

- (1) Whoever violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree. Whoever is found guilty of a second offense of violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree and shall be fined one thousand dollars (\$1,000) which fine shall be mandatory and shall not be suspended or remitted, and may be imprisoned for a term not to exceed six months.
- Any dangerous dog which attacks a human being or another domestic animal may be ordered destroyed when in the court's judgment such dangerous dog represents a continuing threat of serious harm to human beings or other domestic animals.
- Any person found guilty of violating this section shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food and veterinary expenses necessitated by the seizure of any dog for the protection of the public, and such other expenses as may be required for the destruction of such dog.

(Ord. 1986-106. Passed 12-17-86.)

## CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF STREETSBORO

### 505.13 DANGEROUS ANIMALS; PERMIT; BOND; INSPECTION.

- (a) As used in this section, "dangerous animal" means and includes any wild mammal, reptile or fowl which is not naturally tame or gentle but is of a wild nature or disposition and which because of its size, vicious nature or other characteristics would constitute a danger to human life or property if it is not kept or maintained in a safe manner or in secure quarters.
- (b) No person shall keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the City any dangerous animal unless a special animal permit therefor is first obtained from the Health Department.
- (c) The Health Department shall issue a special permit for the keeping or maintenance of a dangerous animal if it finds:
- (1) The animal is at all times kept or maintained in a safe manner and that it is at all times confined securely so that the keeping of such animal will not constitute a danger to human life or the property of others.
- (2) Adequate safeguards are made to prevent unauthorized access to such animal by members of the public.
- (3) The health or well-being of the animal is not in any way endangered by the manner of keeping or confinement.
- (4) The keeping of such animal does not constitute a nuisance and will not harm the surrounding neighborhood or disturb the tranquility of the surrounding neighborhood.
- (5) The keeping of such animal will not create or cause offensive odors or constitute a danger to public health.
- (6) The quarters in which such animal is kept or confined are adequately lighted and ventilated and are so constructed that they may be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (7) The applicant for such special permit proves his ability to respond in damages to and including the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for bodily injury to or death of any person or persons or for damages to property owned by any other person which may result from the ownership, keeping or maintenance of such animal. Proof of liability to respond in damages may be given by filing with the Health Department a certificate of insurance from an insurance company authorized to do business in the State stating that the applicant is, at the time of his application, and will be during the period of such special permit, insured against liability to respond in such damages, or by posting with the Health Department a surety bond conditioned upon the payment of such damages during the period of such special permit. Such certificate of insurance or bond shall provide that no cancellation of the insurance or bond will be made unless ten days' written notice is first given to the Health Commissioner.

- (d) The Health Department, in investigating any applicant for a permit under this section or in the enforcement of this section, is authorized to consult with and seek the advice of the Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the Animal Protective League, the Humane Society, the Department of Agriculture, or any other individual, agency, organization or society which may be able to provide information and advice concerning the keeping of dangerous animals.
- (e) Prior to the annual renewal of any special permit issued hereunder and at least once, not more than three months after the issuance of any such special permit or after its renewal, the Health Department shall inspect the premises subject to such special permit to determine whether the person to whom it has been issued is continuing to comply with all of the conditions specified in this section. If the Health Department determines during any such inspection that any of the specified conditions are being violated, he shall refuse to renew any such special permit, or he shall revoke such special permit in the event that such violation is not corrected within such period of time as he shall direct. A fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall be charged for each such quarterly inspection.
- (f) In no event shall a permit be issued for the keeping of more than one dangerous animal at any single location.
- (g) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the keeping of dangerous animals in the following cases:
- (1) The keeping of such animals in zoos, bona fide educational or medical institutions, museums or any other place where they are kept as live specimens for the public view or for the purpose of instruction or study.
- (2) The keeping of such animals for exhibition to the public of such animals by a circus, carnival or other exhibit or show.
- (3) The keeping of such animals in a bona fide, licensed veterinary hospital for treatment.
- (4) Dangerous or poisonous reptiles may be maintained by bona fide educational or medical institutions for the purpose of instruction or study, provided such reptiles are securely confined and properly cared for in a manner satisfactory to the Health Department.
- (h) No permit shall be issued for the keeping of dangerous animals unless all provisions of this section are complied with and a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) is paid to the Health Department. Permit fees shall be paid annually on or before the start of the license year.
- (i) Whoever violates this section or fails to comply therewith or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or thirty days in jail, or both. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which such nuisance is permitted to exist.

(Ord. 1975-73. Passed 9-22-75.)

### 505.14 VICIOUS DOGS.

- (a) As used in this section, "vicious dog" means and includes:
- (1) Any dog with a known propensity, tendency or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of humans or domestic animals; or
- (2) Any dog which attacks a human or domestic animal without provocation; or
- (3) Any dog owned or harbored primarily or in part for the purpose of dog fighting or any dog trained for dog fighting.
- (b) No person owning or harboring or having the care or custody of a vicious dog shall permit such dog to go unconfined on the premises of such person. A vicious dog is "unconfined" as the term is used in this section if such dog is not securely confined indoors or confined in a securely enclosed and locked pen or a dog run area upon the premises of such person. Such pen or dog run area must also have either sides six feet high or a secure top. If the pen or structure has no bottom secured to the sides, the sides must be imbedded into the ground no less than one foot.
- (c) No person owning or harboring or having the care of a vicious dog shall permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such person unless such dog is securely muzzled and restrained with a chain having a minimum tensile strength of three hundred pounds and not exceeding three feet in length.
- (d) No person shall own or harbor any dog for the purpose of dog fighting, or train, torment, badger, bait or use any dog for the purpose of causing or encouraging the dog to unprovoked attacks upon humans or domestic animals.
- (e) No person shall possess with intent to sell, or offer for sale, breed or buy or attempt to buy within the City any vicious dog.
- (f) Any person owning or harboring or having the care of any vicious dog shall maintain a policy of insurance in an amount not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) insuring such person against any claim, loss, damage or injury to persons, domestic animals or property resulting from the acts, whether intentional or unintentional, of the vicious dog. Such person shall produce evidence of such insurance upon the request of a law enforcement agent.
- (g) In the event that a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a vicious dog is being harbored or cared for in violation of subsections (b), (d), (e) or (f) of this section, the law enforcement agent may petition a court of competent jurisdiction to order the seizure and impoundment of the vicious dog pending trial. In the event that a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a vicious dog is being harbored or housed in violation of subsection (c) of this section, the law enforcement agent may seize and impound the vicious dog pending trial.

- (h) (1) Whoever violates any provision of this section shall he guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree. Whoever is found guilty of a second offense of violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree and shall be fined one thousand dollars (\$1,000), which fine shall be mandatory and shall not be suspended or remitted.
- (2) Any vicious dog which attacks a human or domestic animal may be ordered destroyed when in the court's judgment, such vicious dog represents a continuing threat of serious harm to humans and domestic animals.
- (3) Any person found guilty of violating this section shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food, veterinary expenses for identification or certification of the breed of animal or boarding and veterinary expenses necessitated by the seizure of any dog for the protection of the public, and such other expense as may he required for the destruction of any such dog.

(Ord. 1985-89. Passed 8-26-85.)

### 505.15 REPORT OF ESCAPE OF EXOTIC OR DANGEROUS ANIMAL.

- (a) The owner or keeper of any member of a species of the animal kingdom that escapes from his custody or control and that is not indigenous to this State or presents a risk of serious physical harm to persons or property, or both, shall, within one hour after he discovers or reasonably should have discovered the escape, report it to:
- (1) A law enforcement officer of the Municipality and the sheriff of the county where the escape occurred; and
  - (2) The Clerk of the Municipal Legislative Authority.
- (b) If the office of the Clerk of the Legislative Authority is closed to the public at the time a report is required by subsection (a) hereof, then it is sufficient compliance with subsection (a) hereof if the owner or keeper makes the report within one hour after the office is next open to the public.
- (c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree.
  (ORC 2927.21)

### BARBERTON CODIFIED ORDINANCES

### 618.19 DANGEROUS DOGS.

- (a) As used in this section, "dangerous dog" means and includes:
- (1) Any dog with a known propensity, tendency or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals;
- (2) Any dog which attacks a human being or domestic animal without provocation; or
- (3) Any dog owned or harbored primarily or in part for the purpose of dog fighting or any dog trained for dog fighting.
- (4) The term "dangerous dog" shall include Pit Bull Terriers. The term "Pit Bull Terrier" is hereby defined as any Staffordshire Bull Terrier breed of dog, any American Staffordshire breed of dog, or any mixed breed of dog which contains as an element of its breeding the breed of Staffordshire Terrier as to be identifiable as partially of the breed of Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier.

No dog shall be deemed dangerous if it bites, attacks or menaces a trespasser on the property of its owner or harms or menaces anyone who has tormented or abused it.

- (b) No person owning, harboring or having the care or custody of a dangerous dog shall suffer or permit such dog to go unconfined on the premises of such person. A dangerous dog is "unconfined" if such dog is not securely confined indoors or confined in a securely enclosed and locked pen or dog run area upon the premises of such person. Such pen or dog run area must have either a secure top or sides that are at least six feet high. If the pen or structure has no bottom secured to the sides, or if a dog is a type which burrows, the sides must be imbedded into the ground not less than one foot. Such pen or structure shall be set back at least four feet from any adjacent property line. Such structure shall be clearly marked with a sign containing the words "Dangerous Dog." Further, a sign shall also be placed on the premises where the pen or structure is located so as to be clearly legible from the public street or sidewalk adjacent to the premises, indicating that a dangerous dog is located on said premises.
- (c) No person owning, harboring or having the care or custody of a dangerous dog shall suffer or permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such person unless such dog is securely muzzled and restrained with a chain having a minimum tensile strength of 300 pounds and not exceeding three feet in length.
- (d) No person shall own or harbor any dog for the purpose of dog fighting, or train, torment, badger, bait or use any dog for the purpose of causing or encouraging such dog to unprovoked attacks upon human beings or domestic animals.
- (e) No person shall possess with intent to sell, or offer for sale, breed, buy or attempt to buy, within the City, any dangerous dog.
- (f) Any person owning, harboring or having the care or custody of any dangerous dog shall maintain a policy of insurance in an amount not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) insuring such person against any claim, loss, damage or injury to persons, domestic animals or property resulting from the acts of the dangerous dog. Such person shall file a copy of such insurance policy with the Police Division.
- (g) If a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a dangerous dog is being harbored or cared for in violation of divisions (b), (c) or (d) of this section, the law enforcement agent may petition a court of competent jurisdiction to order the seizure and impoundment of the dangerous dog pending trial. If a law enforcement agent has probable cause to believe that a dangerous dog is being harbored or housed in violation of division (c) or (d) of this section, the law enforcement agent may seize and impound the dangerous dog pending trial.

- (h) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree. For a second offense, whoever violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree and shall be fined one thousand dollars (\$1,000), which fine shall be mandatory and shall not be suspended or remitted, and may be imprisoned for not more than six months.
- (i) Any dangerous dog which attacks a human being or another domestic animal may be ordered destroyed when, in the court's judgment, such dangerous dog represents a continuing threat of serious harm to human beings or domestic animals.
- (j) Any person found guilty of violating this section shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food and veterinary expenses, necessitated by the seizure of any dog for the protection of the public, and such other expense as may be required for the destruction of such dog.
- (k) No Pit Bull Terrier, as it is defined in division (a) of this section, shall be kept, stored, harbored, maintained, owned and/or housed within the city limits unless all of the following conditions are met as approved by the City Safety Director:
- (1) Anyone owning, harboring, or having the care or custody of a Pit Bull Terrier shall have registered the dog or dogs with the County of Summit, State of Ohio, no later than the effective date of Ordinance 181-2007 and written verification of the same is provided to police upon request and kept on file with the City;
- (2) The owner has never been convicted anywhere with keeping a dangerous dog, or some other similar law and the dog has never been declared by a court to be a dangerous dog;
- (3) The owner has never been convicted more than twice for dog at large and/or any other "leash law" type violation;
- (4) The owner has never been convicted of cruelty to animals and/or any similar offense;
- (5) The pit bull or pit bulls have been spayed/neutered as of the effective date of the ordinance and written verification of the same is provided to police upon request and kept on file with the city;
- (6) The dog owner does not currently owe the City of Barberton any other outstanding fines or penalties;
- (7) The dog owner has properly insured the dog per the requirements of the within ordinance and has provided the City with proof of same pursuant to this current ordinance governing pit bull ownership;
- (8) The dog has had a scannable microchip implanted so as to permit verifiable identification and/or tracking by City officials. Such microchip implant must be obtained at the owner's cost and verification that same has been obtained must be kept on file with the City;
- (9) The dog owner has complied with this ordinance with respect to any and all of its other provisions including, but not limited to, any requirements regarding the proper enclosure and restraint of dogs;
- (l) For purposes of division (k), the term "owner" is hereby defined to include any individual and/or entity who is temporarily in custody and/or possession of a pit bull.
- (m) Divisions (k) and (l) shall take effect on February 1, 2008. (Ord. 113-1987. Passed 4-13-87; Ord 115-1989. Passed 7-10-89; Ord. 181-2007. Passed 12-17-07.)

# 618.17 TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OR POSSESSION OF DOG; CLASSIFICATION AS DANGEROUS, NUISANCE OR VICIOUS DOG; COURT HEARING; APPEAL.

- (a) As used in this section:
- (1) A. "Dangerous dog" means a dog that, without provocation, and subject to subsection <u>618.17</u>(a) (1)B. of this section, has done any of the following:
  - 1. Caused injury, other than killing or serious injury, to any person;
  - 2. Killed another dog;
- 3. Been the subject of a third or subsequent violation of division (C) of Section 955.22 of the Ohio Revised Code [Section 618.18(b) of this Chapter].
- B. "Dangerous dog" does not include a police dog that has caused injury, other than killing or serious injury, to any person or has killed another dog while the police dog is being used to assist one or more law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duties.
- (2) "Menacing fashion" means that a dog would cause any person being chased or approached to reasonably believe that the dog will cause physical injury to that person.

(Ord. 2012-078. Passed 6-4-12.)

- (3) A. Subject to subsection (a)(3)B hereof, "huisance dog" means a dog that without provocation and while off the premises of its owner, keeper, or harborer has chased or approached a person in either a menacing fashion or an apparent attitude of attack or has attempted to bite or otherwise endanger any person, or has bitten or caused serious physical harm to another dog or cat.
- B. "Nuisance dog" does not include a police dog that while being used to assist one or more law enforcement officers in the performance of official duties has chased or approached a person in either a menacing fashion or an apparent attitude of attack or has attempted to bite or otherwise endanger any person.

(Ord. 2012-194. Passed 11-19-12.)

- (4) "Police dog" means a dog that has been trained, and may be used, to assist one or more law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duties.
  - (5) "Serious injury" means any of the following:
    - A. Any physical harm that carries a substantial risk of death;
- B. Any physical harm that involves a permanent incapacity, whether partial or total, or a temporary, substantial incapacity;
  - C. Any physical harm that involves a permanent disfigurement or a temporary, serious disfigurement;
- D. Any physical harm that involves acute pain of a duration that results in substantial suffering or any degree of prolonged or intractable pain.
- (6) A. "Vicious dog" means a dog that, without provocation and subject to subsection <u>618.17</u>(a) (6)B., has killed or caused serious injury to any person.
  - B. "Vicious dog" does not include either of the following:
- 1. A police dog that has killed or caused serious injury to any person while the police dog is being used to assist one or more law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duties;
- 2. A dog that has killed or caused serious injury to any person while a person was committing or attempting to commit a trespass or other criminal offense on the property of the owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog.
- (7) "Without provocation" means that a dog was not teased, tormented, or abused by a person, or that the dog was not coming to the aid or the defense of a person who was not engaged in illegal or criminal activity and who was not using the dog as a means of carrying out such activity.

- (b) Designation as Nuisance Dog, Dangerous Dog or Vicious Dog; Court Hearing and Appeal.
- (1) The Berea Municipal Court or Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court having territorial jurisdiction over the residence of the owner, keeper, or harborer of a dog shall conduct any hearing concerning the designation of the dog as a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog.
- (2) If the City's Animal Control Officer has reasonable cause to believe that a dog in the City's jurisdiction is a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog, the Animal Control Officer shall notify the owner, keeper, or harborer of that dog, by certified mail or in person, of both of the following:
- A. That the Animal Control Officer has designated the dog a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog, as applicable;
- B. That the owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog may request a hearing regarding the designation in accordance with this section. The notice shall include instructions for filing a request for a hearing in Cuyahoga County in which the dog's owner, keeper, or harborer resides.
- (3) If the owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog disagrees with the designation of the dog as a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog, as applicable, the owner, keeper, or harborer, not later than ten days after receiving notification of the designation, may request a hearing regarding the determination. The request for a hearing shall be in writing and shall be filed with the Berea Municipal Court or Common Pleas Court that has territorial jurisdiction over the residence of the dog's owner, keeper, or harborer. At the hearing, the person who designated the dog as a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog has the burden of proving, by clear and convincing evidence, that the dog is a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog. The owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog or the person who designated the dog as a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog may appeal the court's final determination as in any other case filed in that court.
- (4) A court, upon motion of an owner, keeper, or harborer or an attorney representing the owner, keeper, or harborer, may order that the dog designated as a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog be held in the possession of the owner, keeper, or harborer until the court makes a final determination under this section or during the pendency of an appeal, as applicable. Until the court makes a final determination and during the pendency of any appeal, the dog shall be confined or restrained in accordance with the provisions of division (D) of Section 955.22 of the Ohio Revised Code [Section 618.18(c) of this Chapter] that apply to dangerous dogs regardless of whether the dog has been designated as a vicious dog or a nuisance dog rather than a dangerous dog. The owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog shall not be required to comply with any other requirements established in the Ohio Revised Code or the City's Codified Ordinances that concern a nuisance dog, dangerous dog, or vicious dog, as applicable, until the court makes a final determination and during the pendency of any appeal.
- (5) If a dog is finally determined under this section, or on appeal as described in this section, to be a vicious dog, division (D) of Section 955.11 [Section 618.17(f) of this Chapter] and divisions (D) to (I) of Section 955.22 of the Ohio Revised Code [Sections 618.18(c)-(g) of this Chapter] apply with respect to the dog and the owner, keeper, or harborer of the dog as if the dog were a dangerous dog, and Section 955.54 of the Ohio Revised Code applies with respect to the dog as if it were a dangerous dog, and the court shall issue an order that specifies that those provisions apply with respect to the dog and the owner, keeper, or harborer in that manner. As part of the order, the court shall require the owner, keeper, or harborer to obtain the liability insurance required under division (E)(1) of Section 955.22 of the Ohio Revised Code in an amount described in division (H)(2) of Section 955.99 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (6) As used in this section, "nuisance dog," "dangerous dog," and "vicious dog" have the same meanings as in Section 618.17(a) of this Chapter.

### (c) (Intentionally omitted)

- (d) Upon the transfer of ownership of any dog, the seller of the dog shall give the buyer a transfer of ownership certificate that shall be signed by the seller. The certificate shall contain the registration number of the dog, the name of the seller, and a brief description of the dog. Blank forms of the certificate may be obtained from the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer. A transfer of ownership shall be recorded by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer upon presentation of a transfer of ownership certificate that is signed by the former owner of a dog and that is accompanied by a fee as required by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer.
- (e) Prior to the transfer of ownership or possession of any dog, upon the buyer's or other transferee's request, the seller or other transferor of the dog shall give to the person a written notice relative to the behavior and propensities of the dog.
- (f) Within ten days after the transfer of ownership or possession of any dog, if the seller or other transferor of the dog has knowledge that the dog is a dangerous dog, the seller or other transferor shall give to the buyer or other transferee, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, and the Cuyahoga County and City of Strongsville dog wardens, a completed copy of a written form on which the seller shall furnish the following information:
  - (1) The name and address of the buyer or other transferee of the dog;
  - (2) The age, sex, color, breed, and current registration number of the dog.

In addition, the seller shall answer the following questions which shall be specifically stated on the form as follows:

"Has the dog ever chased or attempted to attack or bite a person? If yes, describe the incident(s) in which the behavior occurred."

"Has the dog ever bitten a person? If yes, describe the incident(s) in which the behavior occurred."

"Has the dog ever seriously injured or killed a person? If yes, describe the incident(s) in which the behavior occurred."

The dog warden shall furnish the form to the seller at no cost.

- (g) No seller or other transferor of a dog shall fail to comply with the applicable requirements of subsections 618.17(d) to (f).
- (h) Whoever violates subsection 618.17(g) because of a failure to comply with subsection 618.17(d) is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

Whoever violates subsection 618.17(g) because of a failure to comply with subsection 618.17(e) or (f) is guilty of a minor misdemeanor on a first offense and of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree on each subsequent offense.

### KENT SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PROGRAM

**OVERVIEW** - We are pleased to introduce this School Resource Officer (SRO) program to the Kent community for the 2014-2015 school year. Although new to Kent, their existence can be traced back to the 1950's when Flint Michigan started the first known program with the goal of improving police-youth relations. Generally, the SRO has three primary functions in the schools: law enforcement officer, crime prevention specialist and educator. The key to a successful SRO program is to blend these functions to meet the specific needs of the community. In the following sections our SRO program will be outlined taking into account specific needs for the Kent community.

**PURPOSE -** First and foremost, the SRO is a full-time police officer assigned to Kent elementary buildings, Stanton Middle, and Roosevelt High schools. This officer will investigate, report and act on offenses that occur on school property or during school events. In this role, the SRO is there to create and maintain a safe educational environment for the student, faculty and staff. The SRO will be responsible for the majority of law enforcement activities occurring at the school during or immediately before and after school hours. This will involve the traditional enforcement activities of investigating criminal activity, filing charges or making arrests. In addition, the officer is responsible for information sharing between school officials and the police department. The officer will focus on developing a rapport with students to enable them to fulfill the purpose and administer their duties in this position.

Keeping the peace and maintaining a police officer presence in school as a law enforcer is a critical role the SRO will fulfill. The SRO is present to take positive steps to prevent crime, patrolling the property and advising the administration and staff on building security and safety issues. Community awareness of this uniformed presence at the schools is meant to be a deterrent to outside criminal influences as well. The SRO will be able to provide law enforcement assistance to school personnel, parents and students.

This position may enable the SRO to present information to students, parents and school faculty in a variety of law enforcement related topics as necessary or by request. This facet of the program will be based on need and circumstance. The SRO is in a unique position to identify and liaison with troubled youth who may benefit from a diversion from the criminal justice system.

**SRO DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS** - The SRO is a full-time sworn officer of the Kent Police Dept. assigned to provide the law enforcement expertise and resources to assist school staff in maintaining safety, order and discipline within their assigned school.

The SRO may provide educational benefits to students by leading classroom presentations and presenting assemblies covering topics to include law education, legal systems, substance abuse, safe driving, sexual harassment, etc.

The SRO's assigned school building, grounds and surroundings will be their primary area of patrol to include Kent elementary buildings, Stanton Middle (SMS), and Roosevelt High Schools (RHS). The SRO will coordinate with area officers in matters

related to other Kent schools and properties. They are responsible for handling all calls for service at the school and will coordinate the response of other police resources to the school.

The SRO shall wear the regulation police uniform and operate a marked police cruiser while on duty unless otherwise authorized by the supervisor for a specific purpose. The SRO provides a visible deterrent to crime and a positive representative of the police department to students and staff.

The SRO's duty schedule will be determined through collaboration between Kent school officials and the Kent Police Department Operations Captain but will generally be arranged to provide coverage throughout the school day including peak arrival and departure times before and after school. The SRO remains an employee of the city and as such are ultimately supervised, evaluated and directed by the Chief of Police, with input from Kent school officials

The SRO shall make themselves him/herself available for conferences with students, parents, and faculty members in order to assist them with problems of a law enforcement or crime prevention nature.

The SRO will build rapport and trust with students by maintaining a high level of visibility on campus during the regular school day and by attending school activities and other school and community programs as requested by Kent school officials. Such assignments will be included in the SRO regular duties in order to avoid the need for overtime compensation.

The SRO shall respond to emergency situations as requested by school principals or their designee. The SRO shall respond in a customary manner according to training and standard law enforcement techniques to criminal activity which is observed or suspected by the SRO or school staff.

The SRO may assist the principals or their designee in developing plans and strategies to prevent and/or minimize dangerous situations which may result from student unrest.

The SRO shall take law enforcement action as required. As soon as practicable, the SRO shall make the principal of the school aware of such action. At the principal's request, the SRO shall take appropriate law enforcement action against intruders and unwanted guests who may appear at the school and related school function to the extent that the SRO may do so under the authority of the law. Whenever practicable, the SRO shall advise the principal before requesting additional police assistance on campus.

The SRO shall maintain detailed and accurate records of the operation of the SRO program to include a daily log of meetings, contacts, informational items, etc. The SRO shall submit the aforementioned reports as well as other reports as required by the principal or school staff.

The SRO shall not act as a school disciplinarian, as disciplining students is a school responsibility. However, if the principal believes an incident is a violation of the law, the principal may contact the SRO, and the SRO shall then determine whether law enforcement action is appropriate. SRO will not to be used for regularly assigned lunchroom duties, hall monitors or other monitoring duties. However, it is expected

that the SRO will be vigilant and visible during lunch periods when the school is most vulnerable.

In the event an SRO calls off sick from work, the SRO shall notify both his supervisor at the Kent Police Department and the assistant superintendent of the school district.

Recognizing communication and information sharing are essential to the success of the SRO program, sharing information will be governed by the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Administrative Code, Ohio's Public Records Law and relevant Kent Police Department and Kent City School policies.

SRO shall meet weekly or more frequently if necessary, with the school principal or designee for the purpose of exchanging information about crime trends, problem areas or other areas of concern which have potential for disruption in the school or within the community.

The SRO will meet twice monthly with the Kent Police Department Operations Captain to discuss program initiatives, expectations and identify any issues with the position.

### **KENT SCHOOLS RESPONSIBILITIES**

In order for the SRO to effectively carry out his/her duties while on school property there are items that are required and necessary of the position. The KCS shall provide the SRO with the following:

- 1. An office or area in each school during the regular school year suitable to allow for privacy in student/faculty communications.
- 2. Office equipment and supplies to include a phone, desk, chair and file cabinet.
- 3. Keys for building accessibility and access to student discipline files.

**KENT POLICE DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBILITIES -** The Kent Police Department also recognizes responsibilities on behalf of the officer and this department to ensure officer compatibility and program effectiveness.

- 1. The officer will be limited to taking time off during the school year to four personal (comp time or vacation) days.
- 2. The SRO has the option to work the road or take personal time off when school is not in session for parent teacher conference days, cancellations and delays, holidays, spring and holiday breaks, in-service days, etc.
- 3. Time off requests will be granted by the Operations Captain who will be the direct supervisor to the SRO. SRO will not be counted towards staffing on day shift patrol division during school year and so time off requests are not granted by seniority.
- 4. Time off requests beyond the school year are subject to seniority and normal departmental procedures and contractual agreements.
- 5. The SRO can work any extra details, including school functions, without disparate treatment. The equalization methods for extra duty details will be followed.
- 6. The SRO will not be a replacement for requesting security at high school functions. Staff will continue to make requests for off-duty officers as past practices dictate.
- 7. Outside the school year, SRO will "count" towards dayshift staffing and follow all contractual and departmental policy applications.

- 8. The SRO will generally work Mon-Fri 7 am 3 pm annually but will have a flexible schedule as necessity dictates.
- 9. The SRO's lunche shall be taken on school grounds.
- 10. The SRO is permitted to leave school grounds for official duties such as court appearances, scheduled trainings, department meetings or critical incidents involving Kent PD. Proper and timely notice must be given to the RHS and SMS principals.

**SRO SELECTION -** One key element for a successful SRO program is choosing the right officer for the role. For this reason, selection of the SRO must be carefully done to ensure a good match. All candidates will be evaluated by Kent Police and Kent City School representatives. The candidate will be selected and evaluated on the following criteria:

- Likes and cares about kids and can provide past experiences.
- Wants to work in the school and can effectively communicate their reasoning.
- The officer is flexible, patient and even tempered.
- Possesses good communication skills and can relate to students of all ages, especially middle and high school kids.
- Is a good role model.
- Can work independently, is dependable, has high ethics, is a good ambassador to the police department. This can be supported by past performance evaluations.
- The officer is an effective leader, presenter or has training experience.
- At least five years experience in the Kent Police Department patrol division is preferred.
- Must complete and perform well in a candid interview with an SRO selection committee, including Kent school officials and Kent Police Department.
- Candidates should be free of significant disciplinary action within last five years.

**SRO** committee - This committee shall be comprised of representatives from the Kent City Schools and Kent Police Department. This committee shall make themselves or designees available for joint meetings as may be requested by either party for the purpose of resolving any issues which may arise in the administration and execution of the school resource office program. The committee functions are listed below:

- Define the purpose, position and expectations of an SRO
- Research grant funding sources
- Define the responsibilities/accountabilities of the city and KCS
- Define the terms and conditions of the financials
- Prepare and execute a contract and/or MOU
- Decide on a selection process and execute the selection of an officer
- Send officer to SRO training and/or other training required.
- Meet at least once annually to review the manual, MOU and position prior to the beginning of a new school year.

# KENT CITY - KENT CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PROGRAM

This agreement made and entered into between the City of Kent, a municipal corporation, organized and existing by virtue of the laws of the State of Ohio and the Kent City Board of Education by its duly acting and qualified Superintendent.

Whereas the City and the Board are interested in entering into a contract for the establishment of a school resource officer to provide a more complete liaison between the City of Kent Police Department and the Kent City School System in a cooperative effort to prevent crime and crisis and provide safety and a law enforcement presence.

Therefore the parties, each in consideration for the mutual promises and obligations assumed by the other, agree as follows:

- 1. The <u>Primary Function</u> of the School Resource Officer (SRO) is to act as a liaison between the City's Police Department and the Kent City School District, residents and businesses impacted by the educational institutions through development and implementation of Public Education and Awareness Program: and to maintain a healthy and productive working rapport with intermediate and secondary level students, parents, and school administrators in the capacity of law enforcement education.
- 2. The <u>Objective</u> of the School Resource Officer (SRO) is to provide and instill a sense of safety through officer presence. The School Resource Officer (SRO) will focus on developing a rapport with students primarily at the Roosevelt High School and Stanton Middle school to create and maintain a safe educational environment for the students, faculty and staff.
- 3. The <u>Duties</u> of the School Resource Officer shall be assigned to one full time officer of the Kent Police Department. The officer's assignment will be to fulfill the outlined objectives and functions outlined above, to carry out his duties as further outlined in the School Resource Officer Program Manual and carry out the duties governed by the City of Kent and State of Ohio as a certified peace officer.
- 4. Cost of the Program equals the full-time hourly wage (based on 2080 hours), overtime wages incurred in the performance of SRO duties (based on 1.5 time the officer's base hourly wage, and actual cost of benefits provided annually to a police officer of the KPD.
- 5. The <u>Term of Agreement</u> shall be for one year commencing on the <u>1</u> st day of August, 2014 and terminating on the <u>31</u> st day of July, 2015. Negotiations for a new agreement shall commence no sooner than three months prior to the expiration date of this agreement and no later than two months before the agreement's expiration date.



Traffic Engineering & Safety Meeting on January 16, 2014

The only item discussed at this meeting was the possible closure of Willow Street from College Street to State Route 59. The main concerns are the possible implications it could have on traffic safety around the area and emergency vehicle response for properties located along Willow Street. Kent State University's Associate Vice President of Facilities, Planning, and Operations, Tom Euclide, was in attendance along with Michael Bruder, Executive Director of Facilities, Planning, and Operations. They explained that they would like to work closely with the City to ensure all concerns about the possible road closure are met before asking for final approval.

The current plan was then reviewed and discussed by the Committee. Fire Department access to the new architectural building is off Lincoln Street and E. College St. to the fire lane on the south side of the building. Additional limited access from both east and west is provided on the Esplanade. The Committee also reviewed the various driving routes from the Fire Station to the new building. The two main routes include Summit Street to Willow Street with access to the west side of the building and Haymaker Parkway to Lincoln Street to the east side of the building. Parking was briefly discussed and it was agreed that more parking studies must be done in that area since that portion of older campus has a parking deficit already. The Committee concluded by agreeing more specific review and development of the plans will have to take place between the City and the University to ensure the Fire Department will have the access needed to reach all floors of the new building and to keep traffic implications at a minimum. The Committee saw no fatal flaw at this point in the design.
