Main Street Kent has requested a License to Occupy the Public Right-of-Way for the purpose of placing six seasonal lighting poles to hang holiday decorations across the roadway. The poles will be placed on Erie Street near the intersections of Depeyster Street and South Water Street and on North Water Street near the intersection of Columbus Street. Please see the attached License to Occupy with map for General Location Site Plan and the sample overhead lighting which is being proposed to be purchased and installed by Main Street Kent. It must also be noted that Main Street has also purchased new downtown street pole decorations such as writhes and stars. All new lighting for downtown is commercial grade LED, low power consumption products and as such the even though we will be seeing more lighting there will be less power needed.

Jim Bowling has worked with Main Street Kent regarding specific locations to be used within the right-of-way and the final License to Occupy will limit the occupancy to the area defined as actually needed. The proposed work has been reviewed and no issues have been discovered that would cause a concern to the Service Department. As such the Service Department recommends consideration of Kent City Council the approval of this request to occupy the public right-of-way.

CITY OF KENT, OHIO LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the CITY OF KENT, OHIO, hereinafter called "City" and Main Street Kent, hereinafter called the "Licensee."

The City is the owner, in fee simple, of land, hereinafter known as the "Property." For and in consideration of the covenants, conditions, agreements and stipulations of the License expressed herein, the City does hereby agree the Property may be used by the Licensee for the purpose as outlined in Part 1 below, in accordance with the laws and Charter of the City of Kent. The Property is more particularly described in the attached exhibits listed below.

Exhibit "A" – General Location Site Plans

Exhibit "B" – Detail Drawing with Dimensions N. Water St. at Columbus St.

Exhibit "C" – Detail Drawing with Dimensions S. Water St. at E. Erie St.

Exhibit "D" – Detail Drawing with Dimensions S. Depeyster St. at E. Erie St.

The parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

1. NATURE OF INTEREST:

The Licensee understands that by issuing this license, the City has merely granted the Licensee the right to occupy the right-of-way and this license does not grant or convey to the Licensee any interest in the Property.

2. USE:

- 2.1 The Property shall be used for the purpose of: placement of conduit, foundations, anchor bolts and seasonally for the purpose of overhead decorations stain poles as approved by the City's Engineering Division and in the absence of the strain poles the placement of an approved cover placed so as to protect the foundation anchor bolts and pedestrians as approved by the City's Engineering Division; all costs associated with installation, maintenance and repair shall be paid by the Licensee and for no other purpose.
- No other structural alterations may be made to the City's property without the express written permission of the City of Kent, Director of Public Service.

3. TERM:

The City does hereby agree the Property may be used by the Licensee for a term of one (1) year commencing on November 19, 2012, and ending on November 18, 2013 unless terminated earlier by either party. This license will automatically renew yearly unless one (1) month before expiration either party notifies the other of its intention to terminate per Paragraph 14.

4. NECESSARY LICENSES AND PERMITS:

4.1 Licensee shall be licensed to do business in the State of Ohio and City of Kent, and upon request, Licensee shall demonstrate to the City that any and all such licenses are in good standing. Correspondence shall be addressed as follows:

Main Street Kent 138 East Main Street Kent, Ohio 44240

4.2 Licensee shall secure all necessary permits required in connection with the use of the Property and shall comply with all federal, state and local statutes, ordinances, rules, or regulations which may affect, in any respect, Licensee's use of the Property. Licensee shall, prior to the commencement of any work, obtain and thereafter maintain, at its sole cost and expense, all licenses, permits, etc., required by law with respect to its business use of the Property.

5. STORAGE AND VENDING:

No storage of materials or supplies of any nature will be permitted on the Property except as directly related to the agreed business use of the Property. The strain poles and foundation covers shall be stored by the Licensee when not bolted to the foundations.

6. TAXES:

Licensee agrees to be responsible for and to timely pay all taxes and/or assessments that may be legally assessed on Licensee's interest, or on any improvements placed by Licensee on said Property, during the continuance of the license hereby created, including any real estate taxes. The Licensee must provide written notice to the City, at the address referenced in Paragraph 4.1, within thirty (30) days of payment of all taxes and/or assessments.

7. <u>DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ACT FOR CITY:</u>

The granting of this permit shall not be construed as an abridgment or waiver of any rights which the Director of Public Service has in exercising his jurisdictional

powers over the City highway system. The City Director of Public Service shall act for and on behalf of the City of Kent in the issuance of and carrying out the provisions of this permit.

8. <u>CITY USE OF PROPERTY:</u>

If for any reason the Director of Public Service or his duly appointed representative deems it necessary to order the removal, reconstruction, relocation or repair of the Licensee's changes to the City's property, then said removal, reconstruction, relocation or repair shall be promptly undertaken at the sole expense of the Licensee's thereof. Failure on the part of the Licensee to conform to the provisions of this permit will be cause for suspension, revocation or annulment of this permit, as the Director of Public Service deems necessary.

9. MAINTENANCE OF PROPERTY:

Licensee shall, at its sole expense, keep and maintain the Property free of all weeds, debris, and flammable materials of every description, and at all times in an orderly, clean, safe, and sanitary condition consistent with neighborhood standards. A high standard of cleanliness, consistent with the location of the area as an adjunct of the City, will be required. Defoliant, noxious, or hazardous materials or chemicals shall not be used or stored on the Property.

10. MAINTENANCE OF IMPROVEMENTS:

- 10.1 Licensee, at Licensee's own cost and expense, shall maintain all of his/her improvements to the Property. Licensee shall take all steps necessary to effectively protect the Property from damage incident to the Licensee's use of such Property, all without expense to the City.
- 10.2 Licensee shall be liable to, and shall reimburse the City for, any damage to City owned property that in any way results from or is attributable to the use of said Property by the Licensee or any person entering upon the same with the consent of the Licensee, expressed or implied.

11. HOLD HARMLESS:

Licensee shall occupy and use Property at its own risk and expense and shall save the City, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from any and all claims for damage to property, or injury to, or death of, any person, entering upon same with Licensee's consent, expressed or implied, caused by any acts or omissions of the Licensee.

12. <u>INSURANCE</u>:

12.1 At the time of the execution of this Agreement, Licensee shall, at its own expense, take out and keep in force during the terms of this Agreement:

- (a) Liability insurance, in a company or companies to be approved by the City to protect against any liability to the public incident to the use of, or resulting from injury to, or death of, any person occurring in or about, the Property, in the amount of not less than *Five Hundred Thousand Dollars* (\$500,000.00), to indemnify against the claim of one person, and in the amount of not less than *One Million Dollars* (\$1,000,000.00) against the claims of two (2) or more persons resulting from any one (1) accident.
- (b) Property damage or other insurance in a company or companies to be approved by the City to protect Licensee, and the City against any and every liability incident to the use of or resulting from any and every cause occurring in, or about, the Property, including any and all liability of the Licensee, in the amount of not less than *One Hundred Thousand Dollars* (\$100,000.00). Said policies shall inure to the contingent liabilities, if any, of the Licensee and the City, and shall obligate the insurance carriers to notify Licensee and the City, in writing, not less than thirty (30) days prior to cancellation thereof, or any other change affecting the coverage of the polices. If said policies contain any exclusion concerning property in the care, custody or control of the insured, an endorsement shall be attached thereto stating that such exclusion shall not apply with regard to any liability of the Licensee and the City.
- 12.2 A copy of the "Certificate of Insurance" will be submitted to the City at the time of execution of license and annually thereafter.

13. MODIFICATION:

The terms of this Agreement may be modified upon agreement of the parties.

14. REVOCATION AND TERMINATION:

- 14.1 The City may revoke this license at any time. The Licensee may terminate this Agreement at any time.
- 14.2 In the event this license is revoked or the Agreement is terminated the Licensee will peaceably and quietly leave, surrender, and yield up to the City the Property. The Property will be restored to its previous condition at the expense of the Licensee and no costs for removal will be reimbursed by the City.
- 14.3 Upon revocation of the license or upon termination or expiration of Agreement, any personal property, or other appurtenances, including all footings, foundations, and utilities, placed on the City property will be removed by Licensee. If any such appurtenances are not so removed after ninety (90) days written notice from the City to the Licensee, the City may proceed to remove the same and to restore the Property and the Licensee

will pay the City, on demand, the reasonable cost and expense of such removal and restoration.


15. **RELOCATION**:

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) has released a Request for Proposal (RFP) soliciting applications from local governments and nonprofit organizations located within what ODNR defines as the "Cuyahoga River Area of Concern," for proposed projects that will promote urban canopy restoration initiatives. The grant request amount is a maximum of \$25,000 and it does not have a cash match requirement. This grant presents an opportunity to possibly expand the funds available to the City for tree planting activities associated with the downtown redevelopment project, including in the central business district and along Haymaker Parkway.

I am respectfully requesting Council Committee time to discuss the ODNR grant opportunity in greater detail and to request a resolution from Council authorizing the City to submit a proposal to ODNR, and if a grant is awarded, authorizing the City to execute the grant agreement and appropriate the awarded grant funds for tree canopy restoration activities. The grant application is due on November 30, 2012 so I will need this item approved with the emergency clause.

Digester Lid Replacement

In the 2012 Capital Improvement Plan Kent City Council provided for the replacement of the Number 2 Digester floating lid and mixer. The Number 2 Digester lid and mixer originally installed circa 1964 has been diagnosed with a deteriorated floating cover and inadequate sludge mixing capabilities. Renovation will consist of draining and cleaning the digester, replacing the existing floating cover and installing new sludge mixing equipment. The Number 2 Digester project has been delayed pending funding availability since 2004.

Staff has been informed that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) has requested the nomination of projects for assistance from the Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Fund (WPCLF) for 2013. The use of loan funds will further provide for the solvency of the City Sanitary Sewer Funds by providing for distribution of payment for this project over multiple years. The Current estimated cost of \$825,000 is provided for in the 2013 Capital Budget and by obtaining even a portion of the estimated cost in the form of a WPCLF loan will allow for short term increased solvency of the Sanitary Sewer Fund.

Staff is requesting Kent City Council consideration and approval for staff to apply and if awarded accept the OEPA assistance of a WPCLF loan in 2013 up to the 2013 Capital Budget amount of \$825,000.
