REQUEST FOR COUNCIL APPROVAL

The Fire Department would like to enter into an agreement (MOU) with the Ravenna Township Fire Department on a joint purchase of a hose tester to help perform the required annual NFPA test on our fire hose. This hose tester will be safer to use than the present method and will save wear and tear on our pumper trucks, saving money in the long run. The device, manufactured by Flamefighter will be purchased through Warren Fire Equipment Inc.

The total cost, including shipping will be \$2,800. Kent will pay two-thirds of the cost and Ravenna Twp. will pay one-third of the cost. Maintenance and repair of the device will be split in the same manner.

The City would front the full cost of the unit and be reimbursed by the Ravenna Township for their share.

I am requesting Council Committee time at the December 7th meeting to present this item for Council's consideration. I have attached the Memorandum of Understanding that Jim Silver prepared for distribution to Council.

Kent Panini's LLC - Revised License Agreement for Outdoor Dining

The Service Department is requesting Council time to review a request from Kent Panini's LLC in conjunction with the College Town Kent. Kent Panini's LLC is requesting to expand its outdoor patio at the northeast corner of South Water Street and Haymaker Parkway (SR 59). Kent Panini's LLC worked with the administration to provide a proposal that would enhance the area and minimize the impacts to previous investments in the right-of-way made by the City, College Town Kent, Davey Tree and Kent State University.

The proposed patio expansion will extend south to the gateway sign and the wall around the gateway sign will be extended with the same materials and design to enclose the new patio space. The existing landscaping (trees, shrubs and plantings) currently in the area will be retained. Additional hardscape and seating will be placed between the existing landscaping and the extended wall. Attached are renderings provided by Kent Panini's LLC depicting the proposed patio expansion.

In order for Kent Panini's LLC to expand its patio in the right-of-way, the existing License Agreement to use the right-of-way will need revised. The revised License Agreement includes two additional conditions, besides the addition of the expanded area. The first condition provides for additional review by staff to verify that the same materials and design are used to extend the wall and that the landscaping will be protected. The second condition, provides that the City of Kent will continue to maintain the landscaping that is located within the expanded patio area and that Kent Panini's LLC will annually pay for the maintenance of the landscaping up to \$4,000 per year. These terms were necessary to protect the investments made by the partnership that developed the area. Kent State University and Davey Tree have reviewed and concur with the proposed patio expansion.

CITY OF KENT, OHIO LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the CITY OF KENT, OHIO, hereinafter called "City" and <u>KENT PANINI'S, LLC</u>, hereinafter called the "Licensee."

The City is the owner, in fee simple or via Director's Deed from the State of Ohio Department of Transportation, of land, hereinafter known as the "Property." For and in consideration of the covenants, conditions, agreements and stipulations of the License expressed herein, the City does hereby agree the Property may be used by the Licensee for the purpose as outlined in Part 1 below, in accordance with the laws and Charter of the City of Kent. The Property is more particularly described in the attached exhibits listed below.

Exhibit "A" – Site Plan
Exhibit "B" – License Area Drawing
Exhibit "C" – License Area Description
Exhibit "D" – Proposed Patio Plan

The parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

1. <u>NATURE OF INTEREST:</u>

The Licensee understands that by issuing this license, the City has merely granted the Licensee the right to occupy the right-of-way and this license does not grant or convey to the Licensee any interest in the Property.

2. USE:

- 2.1 The Property shall be used for the purpose of: Constructing and operating an outdoor patio space for restaurant use including the sale of alcohol. The installation of fencing to contain the patio space is also included.

 and for no other purpose.
- 2.2 A 36 inch minimum pull back dimension shall be used for the table and seating layout in the patio.
- 2.3 No structural alterations may be made to the City's property, except as permitted herein, without the express written permission of the City of Kent, Director of Public Service.

3. <u>TERM</u>:

The City does hereby agree the Property may be used by the Licensee for a term of one (1) year commencing on _______, 2016, and ending on _______, 2017 unless terminated earlier by either party. This license will automatically renew yearly unless one (1) month before expiration either party notifies the other of its intention to terminate per Paragraph 14.

4. <u>NECESSARY LICENSES AND PERMITS</u>:

4.1 Licensee shall be licensed to do business in the State of Ohio and City of Kent, and upon request, Licensee shall demonstrate to the City that any and all such licenses are in good standing. Correspondence shall be addressed as follows:

- 4.2 Licensee shall secure all necessary permits required in connection with the use of the Property and shall comply with all federal, state and local statutes, ordinances, rules, or regulations which may affect, in any respect, Licensee's use of the Property. Licensee shall, prior to the commencement of any work, obtain and thereafter maintain, at its sole cost and expense, all licenses, permits, etc., required by law with respect to its business use of the Property.
- 4.3 Separate from the permits described in paragraph 4.2, Licensee shall submit, to the Service Department, final construction plans, shop drawings and other similar information detailing the construction of the Proposed Patio Plan (Exhibit "D") for approval prior to construction of the patio. The Service Department will review, at a minimum, the following plan information to verify that previous public investments in the area will be protected:
 - The expansion of the gateway sign wall uses the same materials
 - The memorial trees are adequately protected and are to remain.
 - The existing landscaping (not including lawn) will be preserved to a reasonable extent.

5. STORAGE AND VENDING:

No storage of materials or supplies of any nature will be permitted on the Property except as directly related to the agreed business use of the Property.

6. TAXES:

Licensee agrees to be responsible for and to timely pay all taxes and/or assessments that may be legally assessed on Licensee's interest, or on any improvements placed by Licensee on said Property, during the continuance of the license hereby created, including any real estate taxes. The Licensee must provide written notice to the City, at the address referenced in Paragraph 4.1, within thirty (30) days of payment of all taxes and/or assessments.

7. <u>DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ACT FOR CITY:</u>

The granting of this permit shall not be construed as an abridgment or waiver of any rights which the Director of Public Service has in exercising his jurisdictional powers over the City highway system. The City Director of Public Service shall act for and on behalf of the City of Kent in the issuance of and carrying out the provisions of this permit.

8. CITY USE OF PROPERTY:

If for any reason the Director of Public Service or his duly appointed representative deems it necessary to order the removal, reconstruction, relocation or repair of the Licensee's changes to the City's property, then said removal, reconstruction, relocation or repair shall be promptly undertaken at the sole expense of the Licensee's thereof. Failure on the part of the Licensee to conform to the provisions of this permit will be cause for suspension, revocation or annulment of this permit, as the Director of Public Service deems necessary.

9. MAINTENANCE OF PROPERTY:

9.1 Licensee shall, at its sole expense, keep and maintain the Property free of all weeds, debris, and flammable materials of every description, and at all times in an orderly, clean, safe, and sanitary condition consistent with neighborhood standards. A high standard of cleanliness, consistent with the location of the area as an adjunct of the City, will be required. Defoliant, noxious, or hazardous materials or chemicals shall not be used or stored on the Property.

9.2 Exhibit "D" – Special Maintenance Conditions:

In conjunction with the maintenance requirements of Section 9.1, for the patio area described in Exhibit "D", the City shall maintain the existing landscaping, including memorial trees that are to remain. The City's staff or contractors shall have reasonable access to this area to maintain the existing landscaping and memorial trees. The City shall send an invoice to Panini's annually for reimbursement of the maintenance of the items described in this paragraph. The cost of the landscaping shall be capped at \$4,000 per year. Panini's shall submit payment within thirty (30) days of receiving the invoice from the City.

10. MAINTENANCE OF IMPROVEMENTS:

- 10.1 Licensee, at Licensee's own cost and expense, shall maintain all of his/her improvements to the Property. Licensee shall take all steps necessary to effectively protect the Property from damage incident to the Licensee's use of such Property, all without expense to the City.
- 10.2 Licensee shall be liable to, and shall reimburse the City for, any damage to City owned property that in any way results from or is attributable to the use of said Property by the Licensee or any person entering upon the same with the consent of the Licensee, expressed or implied.

11. HOLD HARMLESS:

Licensee shall occupy and use Property at its own risk and expense and shall save the City, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from any and all claims for damage to property, or injury to, or death of, any person, entering upon same with Licensee's consent, expressed or implied, caused by any acts or omissions of the Licensee.

12. <u>INSURANCE</u>:

- At the time of the execution of this Agreement, Licensee shall, at its own expense, take out and keep in force during the terms of this Agreement:
 - (a) Liability insurance, in a company or companies to be approved by the City to protect against any liability to the public incident to the use of, or resulting from injury to, or death of, any person occurring in or about, the Property, in the amount of not less than *Two Million Dollars* (\$2,000,000.00), to indemnify against the claim of one person, and in the amount of not less than *Four Million Dollars* (\$4,000,000.00) against the claims of two (2) or more persons resulting from any one (1) accident.

- (b) Property damage or other insurance in a company or companies to be approved by the City to protect Licensee, and the City against any and every liability incident to the use of or resulting from any and every cause occurring in, or about, the Property, including any and all liability of the Licensee, in the amount of not less than *One Hundred Thousand Dollars* (\$100,000.00). Said policies shall inure to the contingent liabilities, if any, of the Licensee and the City, and shall obligate the insurance carriers to notify Licensee and the City, in writing, not less than thirty (30) days prior to cancellation thereof, or any other change affecting the coverage of the polices. If said policies contain any exclusion concerning property in the care, custody or control of the insured, an endorsement shall be attached thereto stating that such exclusion shall not apply with regard to any liability of the Licensee and the City.
- 12.2 A copy of the "Certificate of Insurance" will be submitted to the City at the time of execution of license and annually thereafter.

13. **MODIFICATION**:

The terms of this Agreement may be modified upon agreement of the parties.

14. REVOCATION AND TERMINATION:

- 14.1 The City may revoke this license at any time. The Licensee may terminate this Agreement at any time.
- 14.2 In the event this license is revoked or the Agreement is terminated the Licensee will peaceably and quietly leave, surrender, and yield up to the City the Property. The Property will be restored to its previous condition at the expense of the Licensee and no costs for removal will be reimbursed by the City.
- 14.3 Upon revocation of the license or upon termination or expiration of Agreement, any personal property, or other appurtenances, including all footings, foundations, and utilities, placed on the City property will be removed by Licensee. If any such appurtenances are not so removed after ninety (90) days written notice from the City to the Licensee, the City may proceed to remove the same and to restore the Property and the Licensee will pay the City, on demand, the reasonable cost and expense of such removal and restoration.

15. **RELOCATION**:

A Licensee who licenses property from the City shall not be eligible for relocation payments.

16. <u>UTILITIES</u>

Nothing in this License Agreement is intended, nor shall it, limit the authority granted to private and public utilities from using the right-of-way to maintain their existing infrastructure as granted in the Ohio Revised and Administrative Codes.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Agreement has been executed in duplicate by the parties hereto as of the date herein last written below. Licensee acknowledges receipt of a copy of this Agreement and agrees to comply with the provisions herein contained.

SITE PLAN




EXHIBIT "B" LICENSE AREA DRAWING



DESCRIPTION OF LICENSE TO OCCUPY

Situated in the City of Kent, County of Portage, State of Ohio, and known as being a part of Original Franklin Township Lot 24, Township 3 North, Range 9 West, and being a portion of the existing right of way of S. Water St. (80 feet wide) and a part of the existing right of way of Haymaker Parkway (S.R. 59, variable width) as recorded in Plat Book 19, Page 45 and City of Kent deed, Instrument No. 201107781 and being further bounded and described as follows:



- 6) S 0° 17' 19" E for a distance of 48.22 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 0.0351 acres (1,530 sq.ft.) of land, more or less, and subject to all easements, restrictions and covenants of record as surveyed under the supervision of Steven I. Mullaney, P.S. Number 7900, for Glaus, Pyle, Schomer, Burns & DeHaven, Inc., dba GPD Group, in March of 2012.



PROPOSED PATIO PLAN (SP-1)







Easement to Metroparks serving Summit County for

Hike and Bike Trail Connection

I would like to request committee time in December to discuss the attached easement necessary to link The Portage with The Freedom Connector and Munroe Falls trails. Metroparks serving Summit County is purchasing the Kisamore Property along the river with a State grant. The property (former Sonoco property) is landlocked. The city owns a parcel near the Middlebury Road Bridge that could provide access to this property along the river and "pave the way" for an off-road connection of our trail systems.

The Parks & Recreation Board is requesting that City Council grant the proposed easement to Metroparks serving Summit County for \$1 for trail development purposes. The future trail alignment could vary slightly from this easement if the adjacent Acken parcel is acquired by Metroparks in the future. Attached is a conceptual design that illustrates how The Portage will be linked to the Freedom Connector Trail and Munroe Falls Bike and Hike Trail.

The granting of this easement will enable the acquisition of the Kisamore property by Summit Metro Parks for preservation and future recreation opportunities. By completing this project it will provide increased access to Summit MetroParks from Kent and Portage County. In addition the future connection when completed will provide a safe off-road connection.

I have seen the benefits that the trails system has brought to Summit and Portage County which include increased civic pride, a sense of community and great preservation and recreational resources. Your consideration of this matter is greatly appreciated.





Main Street Water Main - Appropriations Request

The Engineering Division is requesting to appropriate \$40,000 in water funds to start the design of a critical repair on our water mains. There was a recent water main break on West Main Street under the Wheeling and Lake Erie Rail Road tracks. Due to the location of the break, our crews were unable to repair the main under the tracks. Therefore, we capped the water main on both sides of the tracks to maintain water service in the area. The reconnection of the water main is important to providing fire flow, therefore we would like to expedite the design of the repair, which includes installing a new water main in a casing pipe bored under the railroad. It is anticipated that the actual repair will cost approximately \$150,000.

Please be advised that I am working on the following cases in the Portage County Court of Common Pleas:

City of Kent vs. Donna Izaldine -- Property owner cited by Community Development for operating an illegal rooming house. Property owner denied the allegations and appealed to the Court. Property owner further challenges the City's right to define a family. Briefs are being filed with the Court with status conference to follow.

City of Kent vs. Lisa Stamper – Property at 434 Stow Street is abandoned and a safety hazard. City is attempting to get an order permitting City to tear down house. Property owner, who appears to live in California, is evading service. Case is set for status pending service.

City of Kent vs. Club Ramella's – property owner operating restaurant without proper building, health, and fire permits. Preliminary injunction granted. Substantial progress has been made. Agreed Judgment Entry submitted to allow property owner to make additional repairs prior to opening for business. Based upon unrelated cases, property is scheduled for a Sheriff's sale and is under the jurisdiction of the Court of Appeals. Case set for status pending permanent injunction.

State of Ohio ex rel. vs. City of Kent – Club Ramella's alleges that the City of Kent has not complied with all Club Ramella's records requests. City has provided all records that it can. Plaintiff has indicated that they will dismiss claim against City, but the dismissal has not happened yet. Case set for status pending dismissal entry.

City of Kent vs. Terry Rennecker – Property at 535 Bowman is abandoned and a safety hazard. City received an order permitting City to tear down house, but order was stayed pending foreclosure action by bank. Case is not set for hearings (foreclosure action is still seeking service on all parties).
