



Public Hearing

The City Clerk has scheduled Public Hearing at 7:25 pm to allow for public comment on the PY2021 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER).

Unauthorized Items

1. Fire Department, Paramedicine Donation

Chief Myers has requested Council's authorization to accept a \$1,625.75 donation to Kent the Kent Fire Department Paramedicine program from Mike Beder and the Kent Firefighters Association Local 721. (attachment)

Administration Recommendation

I recommend Council accept and allocate the \$1,625.75 donation to the Kent Fire Department Paramedicine program.

Council Action

Authorize the acceptance and allocation of the \$1,625.75 donation to the Kent Fire Department Paramedicine program by voice vote (no Ordinance reading) on the unauthorized items list.

2. Temporary Extension of Architectural Review Board Members Terms

Bridget has requested Council's authorization to temporarily extend the terms of Bridget Tipton (expires 12/31/22) and Dave Basista (expires 12/31/22) on the ARB until Council has finalized the Design Guidelines update and determined the membership requirements under the new Guidelines.

Administration Recommendation

I recommend Council authorize the temporary extension of the ARB member terms to ensure proper coverage of ARB matters while the Design Guideline update is underway.

Council Action

Authorize the temporary extension of the ARB member terms until the Design Guideline update is completed and Council has determined the role and membership needs of the ARB under the new Guidelines.

Police Officer Commendation

Chief Shearer has requested a few minutes during the Council meeting to publicly recognize Officer Matt Butcher for his exemplary work in safely resolving an incident involving a person experiencing a mental health crisis.

Information Items

1. Monthly Permit and Zoning Reports

Bridget Susel has enclosed copies of the monthly zoning and permit violations report for August 2022. Permit revenues were \$24,071.61 for June with the most permits being issued for Existing Multi-family (35 permits). There were 19 code enforcement items for the month. (attachment)

2. Fire Incident Reports

Chief Myers has provided a copy of the fire and emergency medical services report for July 2022. In 2022 YTD calls for fire service are up 36.6% (219 calls) for July compared with YTD 2021; fire mutual aid assistance is up by 4 calls (to 12) in 2022 as compared to 2021; and EMS responses are up 6.6% (137 calls) for July, compared to YTD 2021. 3. Fire Incident Reports

Chief Myers has provided a copy of the fire and emergency medical services report for August 2022. In 2022 YTD calls for fire service are up 31% (244 calls) for August compared with YTD 2021; fire mutual aid assistance is up by 4 calls (to 12) in 2022 as compared to 2021; and EMS responses are up 7.7% (183 calls) for August, compared to YTD 2021.
