4. AMATS Bike Crash Report

AMATS recently completed an analysis of reported bicycle accidents region-wide and given the growing interest in protecting cyclists and pedestrians here in Kent, I wanted to share the findings of the report with you. Coincidently, I read an article this week that summarized the success of cycling safety in Portland and one of the main conclusions was the more bicyclists that ride and are seen riding in the community, the more the community learns to expect to see cyclists and the more aware locals become for cyclist safety. In other words, the greatest gains for bicycle safety come from getting more people to ride. I think we're seeing that transition begin here in Kent and I'm hopeful that the increasing number of cyclists that we're all seeing around town is impacting the culture of sharing the road and at times the sidewalks. 5. Health Board Meeting Minutes and Department Statistics
